During the 2002-2001 school year, Johnson served as Professor of Religion at Jacksonville College. Dr. Johnson was pastor of Maranatha Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon, Texas from April 1990 until March 1992. At that time he was also employed as part-time instructor at the Baptist Missionary Association Theological Seminary. August 1992 he was appointed to the position of Professor of Christian Education and has continued at that position

until the present. New courses he has developed and taught at the seminary since the Fall of 1992 include, Group Counseling, Adult Development and Aging, and Christian Education of Adults. He also formed several correspondence courses including: Introduction to Psychology, Baptist History, and Teaching for Results. In 1998, he was appointed Self-Study Director in order to direct the Baptist Missionary Association Theological Seminary's reaffirmation of accreditation process with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

In April of 1995, Dr. Johnson served on a panel discussion on the program of the Second Annual Texas University & Seminary Conference on Aging (A Regional White House Conference on Aging Event). Johnson completed a nine-month internship in Clinical Pastoral Education at Rusk State Hospital in 1984. The training included serving on treatment teams in both the Substance Abuse Unit and the Maximum Security Unit of this state mental hospital.
